# **College Rules**

- 1. All students of the college shall be bound by the rules and regulations of the college. Ignorance of rules is no excuse.
- 2. Every student is expected to be regular and punctual in attending the college.
- 3. Students are expected to remain in standing posture in the campus during the time of the prayer song, observing complete silence at the stroke of the third bell at 9:30 a.m. They shall keep silence in the campus during working hours.
- 4. Students who are free during any period should remain in the reading room and utilise the time profitably.
- 5. Students are expected to co-operate in keeping the college buildings and campus neat and tidy. Writing and making marks on the walls or furniture or dropping ink on the floor or throwing paper anywhere except in the receptacles provided for the purpose, is strictly prohibited.
- 6. Prior permission of the Principal is necessary:
  - a. For organising special meetings, entertainments or social functions.
  - b. For inviting persons who are not members of the teaching staff of the college, for any function in the college.
  - c. For collection and subscription of any kind from the members of the college.

- d. For distribution or display of any literature.
- 7. Students shall get prior permission of the Principal, for residing anywhere other than with their parents.
- 8. Smoking and using intoxicants are strictly prohibited in the college and its premises.
- 9. Any student suspended from the college is not allowed to enter the college or its premises during the period of suspension.
- Students are strictly forbidden to engage in activities, political or otherwise, which would interfere with the normal life and work of the college, as per directions of the Hon. High Court of Kerala. Students who violate this rule will be strictly dealt with as per directions of the College Council. Therefore, students must keep away agitations from all sorts of like strikes. disturbing classes, taking out processions, uttering slogans etc. in the college premises. They must not bring flags, placards, leaflets, pamphlets, notice boards, banners, posters or any publicity material of any political party or student organisation to the campus.
- 11. Notice signed or countersigned by the Principal and published on the Notice Board should be taken note of by the members of the college.
- 12. Students are strictly forbidden to make complaints or submit petitions in a body. Students can put their grievances in writing in the Complaint Box placed in

the Front office area.

- 13. Every student should wear clean and respectable dress in the class rooms, buildings and premises of the college. Girls other than those wearing saree must use shawl. They shall not wear short or tight fitting Kurtas; skin fit jeans or leggings with short tops. Boys are not allowed to wear low waist trousers and T-Shirts without collars. T-Shirts with casual inscriptions are not allowed.
- 14. When the Principal or a visitor or a teacher enters a class, students should rise and remain standing till they are directed to sit.
- 15. In every class each student shall have a special seat and shall not occupy any other seat without the permission of the Lecturer-in-charge of the class.
- 16. An identity card will be issued to every student after admission. Identity Card must be worn by the student whenever he/she is in the campus and should be produced for inspection by any member of the staff.
- 17. No student shall be allowed to leave the class room without the permission of the Lecturer-in-charge of the class until the class is dismissed.
- 18. Every student shall handle the college property with care and shall do everything in his power to keep the furniture safe and clean. Students who handle the college furniture and property carelessly are liable to serious punishment.

- 19. Authority of the Principal in matters of discipline extends to the conduct of the students outside the college.
- 20. Students shall not entertain outsiders inside the campus.
- 21. Outsiders are strictly prohibited to meet students inside the campus without the permission of the Principal.
- 22. Bursting of crackers inside the campus is strictly prohibited.
- 23. As per the order of the Government of Kerala, Mobile phones with camera, fashion show and cinematic dance are banned in all educational institutions. Mobile phones without camera must be switched off in class rooms and inside the campus. The Principal and Ethics Committee reserve the right to take disciplinary action against those who violate the order.
- 24. Boys and girls are advised to park their two-wheelers in the parking area behind the wicket gate in the portion allotted to them.
- 25. Traditional art and cultural programmes can be staged inside the campus with the prior permission of the Ethics committee.
- 26. Any question not covered by the above rules will be decided by the Principal.
- 27. The college follows Day System of Time Table, with the first working day designated as First Day and so

on. In the event of a holiday being declared on the Second Day, the next working day will follow the time table of the Second Day.

#### Admission and Withdrawal

- 1. Application for admission must be made in the prescribed form and the applicants should produce the necessary documents before admission.
- 2. Admission can be denied to any candidate by the Principal in the interest of the college without assigning any reason.
- 3. Students coming from other Universities / Boards should produce the Eligibility Certificate and Migration Certificate at the time of admission.
- 4. No candidate for admission will be enrolled or allowed to attend classes until the prescribed fee has been paid.
- No student shall be considered to have been enrolled in college unless he/she has attended at least one day of the college term or has paid the fees or portions thereof.
- 6. A student applying for Transfer Certificate during a college term on any day of which it has been opened or applying not later than the 5th working day of the college term immediately following shall be given such certificate upon payment of all fees or other dues or of such portions thereon as per rules.
- 7. A fee of Rs.25/- shall be levied for Duplicate T.C. and a

- fine of Rs.15/- for late issue of T.C. A certificate from the  $I^{\text{St}}$  class Magistrate is required for the issue of duplicate T.C.
- 8. Ordinarily, a notice of 24 hours is necessary for the issue of Transfer Certificate, copies of the original certificates, Conduct certificate etc.
- 9. A student has to apply to the Principal for any certificate or for the return of S.S.L.C. or any other certificates issued by the University or any other body and received in the college at the time of admission. The certificates will be issued to the student in person, only after he pays the fees and other dues he owes to the college.
- 10. No certificate will be sent by post, unless a stamped and self-addressed envelope is sent for the purpose.
- 11. A student applying for any certificate must do so in the application form prescribed for it.

### **Caution Deposit**

Every student shall pay the caution deposit at the rates prescribed by the Government along with the first instalment of fees at the time of admission. The students should keep in safe custody, the receipts issued for remittance of the Caution Deposit amount during the tenure of the course. The caution deposit amount will be refunded, only if the concerned receipt issued from the college is produced along with the application for refund of the Caution Deposit.

#### Collection of Fees

- 1. Tuition fee will be collected in three instalments. The first instalment including the Special Fee prescribed will be collected on the date of admission. Subsequent instalments will be collected on or before the 7th working day of each term.
- 2. If any student fails to pay the fees or special fees on the due date he/ she shall be liable to pay a fine of Rs.5/- along with the fees on or before the 10th day after the due date.
- 3. If the fees with the fine of Rs.5/- is not paid on or before the 10th day after the due date an additional fine of Rs.10/- will be charged. If the fees and fine are not paid within 15 days from the due date the name of the student will be removed from the rolls of the college. If he/she is to be re-admitted he/she has to apply for the special permission of the Principal and also has to remit the re-admission fee of Rs.50/- and the arrears of fees with fine. Fees will be collected only up to 2 p.m.

#### **Attendance and Leave of Absence**

- Attendance will be marked at the beginning of each period by the teacher engaging the class. Latecomers have no right to claim attendance for the period.
- 2. Application for leave in the prescribed form (page no 92) must be forwarded to the Principal through

the Lecturer-in-Charge in advance. When absence is due to some unforeseen reason, the application should be submitted not later than the first day of the student's return to the college.

- 3. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against those who repeatedly absent themselves from class, without leave.
- 4. The minimum attendance prescribed by the University is 75%. Those who do not earn the required attendance are not qualified to appear for the examination.
- 5. Duty Leave (subject to a maximum of 10) for Physical Education/N.S.S./ Club activities, etc. will be granted only on the recommendation of the teachers concerned.
- 6. The duly recommended leave applications should be forwarded to the Principal not later than one week after the event. No other duty leave will be granted.

### **College Library**

The college has a fully automated library.

- 1. The college library consists of the general library and departmental libraries.
- 2. The library is open to all the members of the college.
- 3. The library will remain open between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. on all working days.
- 4. Books will be issued only on production of I.D Card. The card is not transferable.

- 5. Books from Reference section will not be lent out.
- 6. Books for various Entrance Examinations are available in the Reference section.
- 7. UG students are allowed to borrow three books and PG students, six books.
- 8. Books borrowed by students shall not be retained for more than a week from the date of issue. Failure to this may be charged with a fine of Rs-1/ per day.
- 9. Inflibnet N-list facility is available in the library.
- 10. Members must, on receiving books examine them and report to the Librarian if any damage found therein. If they fail to do so, they will be held responsible for any damage that may be detected afterwards. Any mark made in a book will be considered as damage.
- 11. Books borrowed from the Library may be recalled at any time.
- 12. Private books and personal belongings of the students are to be kept at the entrance, before entering the library. No student is allowed to carry printed matter when they enter the stock room.
- 13. Hall Tickets and T.C. will be issued only after students clear all their dues in the library.
- 14. Renewed books shall not be re-issued to the same student on the same day.

### College Auditorium

Rules to be observed in the use of the college auditorium

1. Students shall not be admitted before 30 minutes of

- the scheduled time for any function, i.e., for a function at 10 a.m. students will not be admitted before 9:30 a.m.
- 2. If the programme is only for the students, they shall produce the identity card along with ticket, pass, if any.
- 3. Women shall be seated at the southern side and men at the northern side.
- 4. The first few rows of seats shall be reserved for staff/guests.
- 5. Prize winners shall be seated next to the staff/guests.
- 6. Strict discipline shall be maintained throughout the functions.

#### **Examination and Test papers**

- 1. Exemption from attendance at examinations and test papers conducted by the college will be granted only by the Principal. Application for such exemption, except in case of illness, must be made in person at least two days before the commencement of the exams.
- 2. In case of illness, the Principal may insist on the production of a medical certificate by a competent doctor and a request from the parent.
- 3. Absence from examination and test papers without leave will render the student concerned liable to serious punishment.
- 4. A suitable fee may be collected from students to whom

- re-examination is offered.
- 5. Malpractice in test papers and examinations will render a student liable to severe punishment, which may amount to refusal of promotion to the next class or expulsion from the college.

# The College Union

- I. The objective of the college union shall be:
  - to train the students of the college, in realising the duties, rights and responsibilities of citizenship,
  - b. to promote opportunities, to mould the character, leadership, efficiency, knowledge and spirit of service among students.
  - c. to organise Debates, Seminars, Workshops, Touring parties and such other functions and
  - d. to encourage Sports, Arts and other cultural, educational, social or recreational activities that are incidental and conducive to the above objectives.
- II. 1. All students of the college shall be ordinary members of the Union and shall have the right to vote and contest in the elections of the Union.
  - 2. All members shall pay the prescribed membership fee towards the College Union fund along with the first instalment of fees.
- III. Tenure of office of the College Union shall be one academic year, which is from 1stJune to 31stMarch.

### The College Magazine

The magazine deals mostly with subjects of literary and academic interest and is usually issued once a year.

The management of the magazine shall be vested in the Magazine Committee appointed afresh every year and composed of the following; the Principal (Ex-officio President), Staff Editor (nominated by the Principal), Staff Advisers (nominated by the Principal for Hindi, Malayalam, Science and Arts Section), the Chief Student Editor and three student editors. The Principal shall be the final authority in all matters pertaining to the magazine.

#### **Study Tour**

Study tours conducted by the college are part of the academic programme. The following instructions should be followed with regard to study tours.

- 1. Applications for study tours should reach the office of the Deputy Director of Collegiate Education at least one month before the scheduled date.
- 2. Study tours or picnics are to be conducted only after getting prior permission from the DD office.
- 3. Applications should be submitted in the prescribed proforma along with the signature and seal of the principal.
- 4. The tour itinerary and the list of students duly signed by the principal, should be submitted along with the application.

- 5. If necessary, an attender can be included in the study tour of BSc/MSc students.
- 6. The Certificate of the HOD countersigned by the principal, showing whether the study tour is a part of the syllabus, should also be attached with the application.
- 7. It should be clearly mentioned in the covering letter and in the proforma whether the tour programme is a study tour or a picnic.
- 8. The student teacher ratio should be 20:1. Only permanent teachers should be deputed to accompany the students.
- 9. A lady teacher must accompany the tour party in which girl students are participants.

#### NCC

NCC training will be given to selected group of students. Every cadet should earn 75% of the attendance for N.C.C. training. Vacancies are reserved for B and C Certificate holders in Defence Services and various other departments.

#### NSS

The National Service Scheme is part of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Govt. of India. It aims at giving training to students in community service. 200 students are selected in two units and the volunteers are given training to engage themselves in constructive social action. Certificates are given to volunteers who complete 240 hours of social work during the course of two years.

#### Women's Cell

A Women's Cell has been instituted as per the direction from the University. The cell concentrates its attention on studies regarding the suppressed status of women and measures for remedying it.

#### **Counselling Centre**

The college has a Counselling Centre. In this modern age, students are always under stress and strain. Well-trained teachers at this centre identify the problems of students and give them proper guidance.

#### **Anti-Ragging Committee**

An Anti-Ragging committee is functioning in the college. The committee is to prevent any form of ragging by constant vigil, observation and precaution. Ragging incidents, if any, will be strictly dealt with and any such incident shall be reported immediately to the authorities concerned and necessary action will be taken.

As per the Kerala Prohibition of Ragging Act 1998, the punishment for ragging is imprisonment for a term up to 2 years and a fine up to ten thousand rupees to those convicted of committing, participating in, abetting or propagating ragging within or outside any educational institution. It mandates dismissal of any student convicted under it from educational institutions. As per the UGC regulations 2009, students can be fined up to 2.5 lakhs if found guilty of ragging.

A national call centre has started operation from 20th June, 2009, to enable ragging victims from across the

country to dial a toll free number to register complaints.

Each day during lunch break regular meetings are held by various religious associations like SCM, Mar Thoma Students Association, Mar Gregorious Orthodox Christian Students Movement, Evangelical Union and Campus Crusade under the common umbrella of Christian College Fellowship (CCF).

#### Parent Teacher Association (PTA)

The Parent Teacher Association takes special interest in the development of the college. The Principal is the convenor of the PTA. There is an executive committee which steers its activities. It works for the welfare of the college and improvement of facilities available to students.

#### Alumni Association

This organisation is intended to make the past and present members of the staff and students of the college come together to pay their grateful respects to the college,

and to keep them in touch with the progress of the college. The annual Alumni meet is held every year on the Deepavali Day. The membership is open to all former students of the college who pay an annual contribution of Rs.100/-. Those who pay Rs.250/- will be life members of the association.

# **Mentoring System**

To ensure personal care and individual attention, the college has introduced mentoring system. The entire student community is divided into small groups and each group is entrusted with a mentor who will personally look after the students of his/her group.

#### Certificate and Add-on Courses

The college conducts part-time career oriented short term certificate courses in computer applications and Addon Courses for degree students. Certificates are awarded by the college.

#### **Brains Trust and Debating Club**

The Brains Trust and Debating Club is a very active co-curricular organisation of the college. Its membership is restricted to limited students. The primary objective of the organisation is the all round development of the personality of the students so that they can provide effective leadership in all walks of life. It arranges debates and discussions on issues of regional, national and international significance and quiz competitions. It also

provides training in public speaking, creative writing, competitive exams etc.

#### Nature Club

The Nature Club aims at inculcating an appreciation of nature among young people and motivating concern for the conservation of nature.

#### **Eco Tourism Club**

The EcoTourism Club aims at generating more attention on tourism and its advantages, creating awareness about the socio-economic relevance of tourism for the development of the state, promoting interest in travel which engenders national integration and exploring potential tourist spots in Kerala.

#### Career Guidance & Placement Cell

A Career Guidance & Placement Cell, affiliated to the University Employment Information and Guidance Bureau, University of Kerala is functioning in the college. Career guidance classes, coaching for competitive examinations and model group discussions and interviews are the regular programmes of the cell.

# Entrepreneurship Development Club

To make students aware of the unlimited developmental potential of the state and to inculcate entrepreneurial culture in students, an

Entrepreneurship Development Club is functioning in the college. This is in association with the Development of Industries and Commerce, Government of Kerala.

#### Walk With a Scholar (WWS) Programme

The WWS Programme was introduced in the college from 2014-15 onwards. This is a programme where 30 of the best students of the first year UG classes are selected for special mentoring and training. Each year they are given 15 hours of mentoring by internal mentors. Career guidance and higher studies orientation are given in the final year.

#### **Computer Centre**

The college has a central computer centre in the campus. Besides offering short term courses in computer applications, students are given facilities for the study of computer applications included in the regular syllabus and to use the internet facility for research and other educational activities at a concessional rate. Internet facility is available in all departments.

#### **Sports and Games**

Christian College has a long tradition of excellence in sports and games. Students of this college are divided into four houses, which compete in a healthy manner in the college Annual Athletic Meet and games every year. Competitions in track and field as well as recreational items are held for students, teachers and administrative

staff, and the winners are awarded prizes. Regular coaching is given to college football, cricket, badminton and wrestling teams.

#### **Subject Associations**

Various Subject Associations function in the college. Students who take up a particular course become members of the association related to that course. These associations arrange special meetings, seminars, lectures and competitions every year.

#### **College Hostels**

Women's hostel caters to the residential needs of female students of the college, mainly post-graduate students. The non-resident warden and the resident warden of the hostel look after the affairs of the hostel, ensuring discipline and well-being of the inmates. 100 students can be accommodated in the hostel.

Men's hostel can accommodate 20 students/male staff members. The non-resident warden and the resident warden of the hostel look after the affairs of the hostel.

#### **Hostel Rules**

- 1. Application for admission to the hostel shall be in the prescribed form supplied by the college office.
- 2. Selection of applicants for admission shall be made by the Principal, assisted by the warden.
- 3. Room allotment will be made by the warden.
- 4. Hostel fees should be paid before the 15th of next

- month. If not, fine will be levied and Principal has the right to ask the student to leave the hostel.
- 5. All hostel dues shall be collected through the management section in the college office.
- 6. The Warden and the Deputy Warden, if any, appointed by the Principal shall be in charge of the hostel and its management
- 7. Mess arrangement shall be under the control of the college.
- 8. All residents of the hostel are expected to be in their rooms between 6 p.m. & 5 a.m. No one is allowed to visit places outside the campus, without the permission of the warden.
- 9. All residents should be in their respective rooms during study hours. Evening prayer will be held at 8 p.m. every day.
- 10. Silence should be observed in the hostel during study hours.
- 11. All residents shall keep their rooms tidy and take good care of the furniture and other hostel properties.
- 12. Leave of absence should be obtained from the warden before proceeding home for short holidays. The time of departure and time of arrival must be marked in the register.
- 13. All cases of sickness shall be reported immediately to the Warden or Deputy Warden.
- 14. Roll call will be taken every day between 8 and 9 p.m.
- 15. Guests and visitors shall not be entertained in the

hostel. Only parent/guardian is allowed to visit the residents of the hostel.

#### Fee Concession & State Scholarship

As per, Kumara Pillai Commission Report, forward community students are eligible for educational concession from the Harijan Welfare Department provided the annual income from all sources of their parents does not exceed Rs.1,00,000/- in the case of Degree classes and Rs.1,00,000/- in the case of PG classes.

Students who secure 45% and more marks at the respective qualifying examination and pass at the first appearance are eligible for unified fee concession. The annual income of their parents should not exceed Rs.1, 00,000/- for Degree Course.

Those who have got admission and secured more than 50% marks in their qualifying examination may apply for the Kerala State Scholarship. Annual income of their parents shouldn't exceed Rs.1,00,000/ for Degree Course.


